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Through The Cross

There are two types of tears: those that heal and those that kill. “If you lose your life for my name's sake, you will find it.” When humbling ourselves before God in prayer, He is merciful with us and brings healing to our souls as good grief involves dying to our ways to come alive in Christ’s bloodline of eternal life. However, when we get prideful, God shuts heaven to get our attention till we turn back towards Him in His kingdom of light, allowing us to be guided again with sight. For enduring the pain of trying to please our ways of the flesh when losing focus of Jesus on the cross, we worship the creature of ourselves, replacing the Creator, who has the greater value.

Pleasing the flesh is a device that Satan uses to keep us from growing in the knowledge of the Holy Spirit, which by grace helps us to be in tune with how God loves us more. For this reason, when we bow a knee to recreational drugs and material things, there’s always a danger of them becoming an idol that can grow bigger than God to devour us in the end. For when God as Creator goes missing to meet the needs of what should have been met by Him all along, we’re going to discover that our growth in a relationship with Him has been stunted. For if God is not here to meet our needs now, how will He meet the needs of what His full life relationship could have brought us in the afterlife? Being out of balance from lacking the truth of Him that

could have brought comfort to my life by not working on my issues now is a risk that I am not willing to take. For I see grace as a pathway to being Holy whole while with Him and will not settle for second-best solutions at present when it's known that my God is an ever-present help in time of need. "Oh Lord, I ask that you cause me to see how you meet all of my needs on earth now, that I'll not be lacking when I meet you face to face in the high hall of heaven."

Through the cross, Jesus Christ is the great healing physician and counselor because He endured all the sufferings of a human man while being God at the same time. Him enduring the cross was for us to be able to recognize the true meaning of death on display and that it was defeated as a seal of His promise of the resurrection. God in our reality allows us to identify death in our own lives as the door to light the way to full reality in its completion.

In God's own words, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." says to me that as long as I keep going to Him with trust, He will direct me to His heart. "We love because God first loved us." Light Beyond The Cross

The simplicity of the cross is that Christ has been crucified for our sins to translate us from out of the kingdom of darkness and into that of light. Then while perpetually growing out of darkness, connected to the vine of Christ, we gradually “Walk in the light while we have the light that darkness no longer over takes us.” We are now woven into God’s kingdom by the seed of Jesus Christ planted at the core of our hearts. Yet, what does all this mean exactly?

When Jesus said from the cross, “It is accomplished,” He ratified the covenant contract between us and God. Our Lord, with the completion of the act of the drinking of the cup, fulfilled all righteousness, just as when He was baptized by the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, John.

He drank the bitter wine vinegar from the cross for our sins as the Lord of Hosts completing the fourth Great Hillel of the Passover supper as promised. In similar fashion, God walked the figure eight between the two parts of the animal blood sacrifice in the honoring of His agreement with Abram that His promise be kept. “His eyes were like a fiery flame. This is a spiritually dangerous way to live, for it keeps us in darkness and the mind dim. It prevents all from drawing near to understanding the love of God to become enlightened to see beyond distraction.

Everything that surrounds us is potentially under Satan's cloak till, "Greater is He that is in me than he that is in the world," separates us to no longer be of it while in it. The light on the other side of the cross must be embraced or we shall remain in darkness bowing to idols rather than the light on the other side of the cross in God's kingdom.

Though do be cautious to be humble and pray for others who you see living in sin. "For the measure you judge, you shall be judged." When judging others, it becomes a stumbling block when hate rises up. "For our righteousness is like filthy rags," which blinds and binds to prevent us from going all the way through the cross, it is a stumbling block to keep us in the dark. We must remain grafted into God's heart, so love the sinner and hate the sin to always stay on the path of God to gain access into heaven. You shall gain the crown of life here and always win.

Epiphany of The Cross
